Josh Fullmer was a fun-loving young man who thoroughly enjoyed school, even though it was not easy for him academically. He never wanted to miss a day of socializing with friends and joking with his teachers. Josh loved wrestling for Coach Duncan and working on cars in shop class. He was a young man of character who visited residents of a local nursing home after school just to give them some company. Josh was a Mississippi River enthusiast and an avid fisherman. As a devoted son, brother, and friend, Josh loved life and lived each day to the fullest. Unfortunately, Josh's life was cut short as he died one week after his high school graduation from Pleasant Valley in 1989 in a car accident.

- *The scholarship is a tuition scholarship and will be paid directly to the institution.
- *A personal interview will be required for finalists.
- *The scholarship will be granted for one year.

The Joshua D. Fullmer Memorial Scholarship is self-perpetuating from a non-profit trust fund established by the family in 1990. The scholarship is funded by interest income generated by the trust and the Pleasant Valley Education Foundation. It is projected that the minimum amount of the scholarship will be \$1,000.00 annually.

The scholarship recipient will be determined by a scholarship committee composed of the following staff members of Pleasant Valley Community High School:

- *High School Principal**
- *High School Associate Principal**
- *High School Activities Director**
- *Guidance Counselor**

The scholarship is open to Pleasant Valley Community High School seniors who plan to continue their education after high school. The scholarship is for tuition only and will be paid directly to the institution that the recipient attends. The scholarship is non-renewable. Should the scholarship committee decide that there are no eligible recipients in a given year, the interest income for that year will be re-invested and will carry over to the following year.

Eligible students must make application to the principal of Pleasant Valley Community High School by March 2 of the year of their graduation. Application forms will be available in the guidance office at the high school. A personal interview will be required. The scholarship will be presented to the recipient at the Senior Awards Program held prior to commencement. A memorial plaque listing the scholarship recipients will be displayed permanently at the high school.
